

What is a Pilgrim?

In American history, we often talk about a special group of people called "the Pilgrims." They were some of the first people to come from England to live in America.

Famous Pilgrims:



William Bradford:

William Bradford was one of the important Pilgrims who came on the Mayflower to help start a new colony



Miles Standish:

Miles Standish was the first military leader of the Plymouth Colony and one of the first to sign an important agreement called the Mayflower Compact



Priscilla Alden:

Priscilla Alden was a Pilgrim who came on the Mayflower and later married another Pilgrim named John Alden

Indians Who Helped the Pilgrims



Squanto:

Squanto was a Native American who taught the Pilgrims how to find food in their new home



Samoset:

Samoset was a Native American who became friends with the Pilgrims



Massasoit:

He was the Sachem (Chief) of the Wampanoag Confederacy and played a crucial role in establishing peaceful relations with the Pilgrims



Wampanoag Tribe:

many members of the Wampanoag tribe collectively helped the Pilgrims by teaching them how to cultivate crops like corn, squash, and beans


Fun Facts

Mayflower: The Pilgrims came to America on a big ship called the Mayflower. They landed in a place called Cape Cod in November 1620. Freedom: The Pilgrims wanted to be free to pray and believe in God their own way. That's why they left their old home and came to America. New Home: The place where the Pilgrims made their new home is now called Plymouth, Massachusetts. It's still there today!

Did You Know?

The Pilgrims made a special agreement called the Mayflower Compact. It was like a promise to work together and follow the same rules in their new home.


